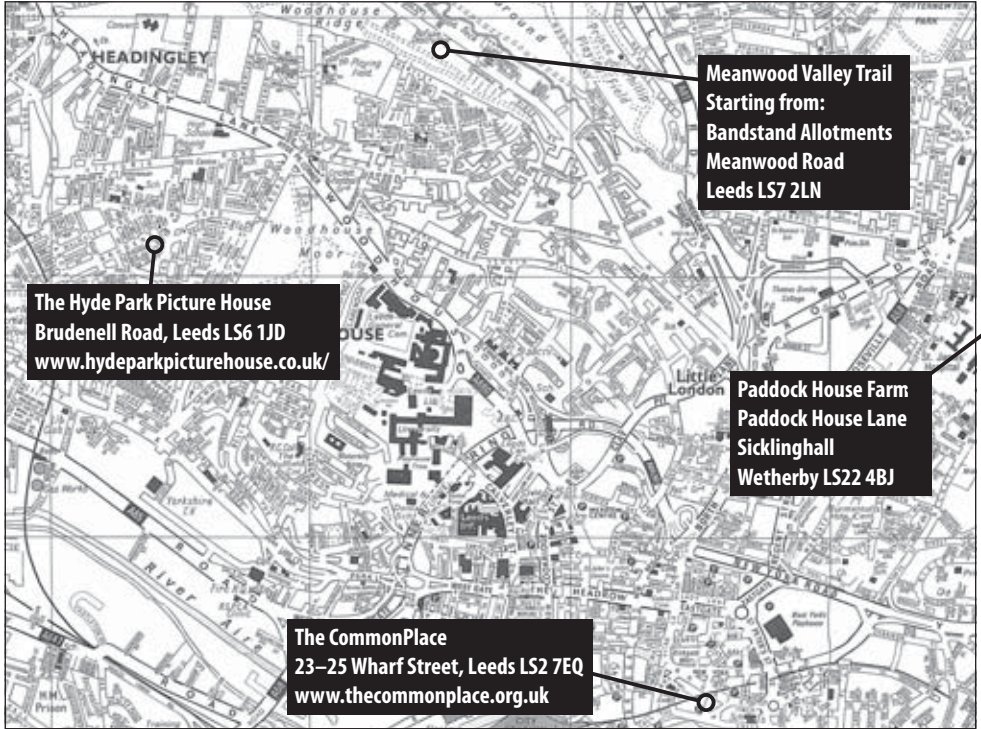
There is no public transport to Paddock House Farm – lift sharing or cycling are the best options.
