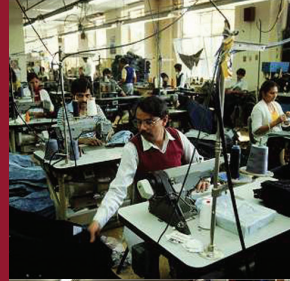
The 25 March 2007 marked 200 years, to the day, that a Parliamentary Bill was passed to abolish the slave trade in the then British Empire. This Act outlawed the slave trade throughout the Empire and made it illegal for British ships to be involved in the trade.

The Conference will highlight the role that slavery played as a system of forced labour and the legacy of racism and exclusion that it has left today in the labour market.

Conference contributions will include speakers from Africa, America, the Caribbean and the UK. A number of workshops will be organised on:
