The Mayor is the chair of Transport for London. At Mayor's Questions in July, he promised that Metronet cleaners would receive a living wage by August.

Not only did this not happen until two months later (and then patchily), but even while he was announcing it, UK immigration laws were being used to clamp down on union activists and members.

Next Wednesday is Mayor's Questions again and this demonstration will hold him, along with the bosses of the cleaning contractors, responsible for immigration victimisations. UK immigration laws are being used to crush the cleaners' struggle. Three cleaners have been deported, and the employers are carrying out checks on many others: hundreds have received letters sayin their National Insurance number may not be correct. There will be 38 meetings, 90 stalls, an all day cabaret starring assorted ranters, poets, singers, comics, all day film showings and two kids spaces. Stalls will be split between the Great Hall and the Octagon room; the whole venue will be wheelchair accessible and non smoking, including the outside areas. Next to the Octagon room will be an all day tea, coffee and snack stall (until 6pm). Food Not Bombs Will be serving food outside the venue.
