Dear Home Secretary,



I have made myself familiar with the case of Christine Nakato Nankya who is due to be forcibly removed to Uganda on Qatar Airways flight QR76 on 27th November 2012.

Christine came to the UK in 2011 and claimed asylum aged 27.

Since the age of 17 Christine was subject to sexual abuse by close members of her family.

Then as part of a family feud over land her father was killed by her brothers. She was then beaten and bullied by them.

Christine has been in detention since April 20> Recently she was moved from Yarlswood IRC to Colnbrook. During the move all of her legal documents were lost making it near impossible for her to fight her case.

Christine is experiencing nightmares, severe sleep disturbance despite her doctors prescribing medication, she is finding it difficult to eat and is having suicidal thoughts.

I call on you to exercise your powers as Home Secretary to cancel the removal directions so that Christine has time to arrange for the evidence that shows she is telling the truth to come from Uganda and to arrange the medical evidence showing she has experienced severe trauma.

Please let this young woman return to safety in Glasgow so she can return to her friends and his private life in the local community.
